SELF-DIRECTED NATURE DISCOVERY HIKE - TEAR & DOG-EAR LIST

In this kind of nature hike, rather than be guided and informed by a certified leader, the 'seekers' direct themselves, using all five senses to notice and identify, but *not* collect, varied aspects of the natural world. These include ones that cannot be directly observed, but only surmised (see: 'snowflake'). So, slow down, breathe deep, and heighten your awareness of your surroundings. No need for a pencil; just make a small tear along the solid line, and dog-ear what you've discovered. Note: this hike can be done as an individual activity...or with one other person...or in teams...or in one big group. Enjoy!
